SOLID METHODS TO SELECT CLASS PROJECTS:

- 1. Set parameters and send out requests to non-profits to submit a project and then let the class or class groups decide on their project *Kathy Parks, Youth Leadership Roane County.*
- 2. App. Streamlined for specific needs with outline of "how to achieve." Armand Hebert, Leadership Paris-Henry County
- 3. Non-Profit Fair to help youth find a project Barbara Virgin, Leadership Weakley County
- Appoint a Chair and Vice Chair of Class Projects Day who submit potential projects M3 – L'Evate's Seniors program.
- 5. Do a S.W.O.T (Strengths, Weaknesses Opportunities, Threats) Assessment of your community and pick a project based on the results *Cheryl Browne, Leadership Fayett*
- 6. Divide class into teams and let them decide. Each team submits three potential projects and, if no duplications, they get their top choice. Upon completion, they present a Power Point presentation on their project to the whole class. *Ellen Wilhoit, Leadership Sevier*
- 7. Class is required to do service hours and often find a project through this process. *Tasha Holmes, Leadership Collierville.*
- 8. Exchange Club has an annual project called "Field of Honor" for children that have died of child abuse, as well as military and first responders who have lost their life. A total of 1,000 flags are placed in a field in honor of them. Our youth and adults help to place the flags and the youth stay for the service to experience the day. Deann Bradford, L'Evate

PAT ON THE BACK RECOGNITION IDEAS:

- 1. Box with paper and pen is placed at the back of the room and if a class member sees another class member do something that exemplifies a leader, then they go to the back sometime during the day and write down their name and what they did and put it in a "Kudos" box. - 2. Adults Annual Class Recognitions at Graduation: Jewel Awards 2 to 3 are given to people in the class who have gone above and beyond in the class of what was expected of them. DIAMOND Award (<u>Did It All Master of Noble Deeds</u>) is given to the person who best exemplifies a leader in the class and exceeded in every way. Youth Leadership Award is given at Graduation Lauren Saliba, Leadership Jackson
- 3. Superlative Awards Leadership Roane County
